


OWNER-OCCUPIED REPAIR SPOTLIGHT


YNDC BREAKS GROUND ON CONSTRUCTION OF TWO NEW **HOMES ON MINERAL SPRINGS AVENUE**

On Wednesday, June 9, YNDC broke ground on the construction of two new homes on Mineral Springs Avenue. The properties will be 1,275 square feet, one story homes and will be rented affordably upon completion. Many partners made this project possible including: Idora Neighborhood Association, Mahoning County Land Bank, PNC Bank, Federal Home Loan Bank of Pittsburgh, City of Youngstown, Councilwoman Lauren McNally, and Joe Koch Construction. This project is part of ongoing efforts to stabilize the Idora neighborhood and greater Glenwood Avenue corridor. Financing for the project is provided by PNC Bank and the Federal Home Loan Bank of Pittsburgh. The lots were provided by the Mahoning County Land Bank, and the homebuilder is Joe Koch Construction.












YNDC ACQUIRES COMMERCIAL BUILDING ON **GLENWOOD AVENUE**

On Monday, April 26, YNDC acquired another commercial building along Glenwood Avenue located at 1133 Glenwood Avenue for renovation. The roof has been replaced and additional work is underway. This project is part of an ongoing effort to clean up and revitalize the greater Glenwood Avenue corridor.

















On Tuesday, June 14, The Youngstown Neighborhood Development Corporation has acquired the historic Foster Theater located at 2504 Glenwood Avenue. The Foster Theater was constructed in 1938 by Joseph Shagrin and the project architect was Morris Scheibel, who designed many prominent Youngstown buildings. The theater originally began as a movie theater. As the postwar era wore on, the Foster, and theaters in general, faced greater competition than ever as television became more prevalent. Shagrin adapted by making the Foster Youngstown's home for art films. Shagrin retired in 1965 and sold the Foster to Louis Sher. Sher initially managed a chain of Art House Theaters, but as mainstream cinema became more popular, he began showing adult films. In a decade when many of the downtown movie palaces shuttered, the Foster remained viable in this new niche. Dee Barber bought the Foster in 1994 and continued operation until recently. YNDC will develop a plan to make significant improvements and reuse the building in a productive and financially sustainable manner. This project is part of ongoing work to revitalize the greater Glenwood Avenue corridor.





GLENWOOD PLAN

The City of Youngstown, Boardman Township, Mill Creek MetroParks, and YNDC have partnered to develop an active transportation plan for Glenwood Avenue from Mahoning Avenue to Shields Road. The project is funded in part through a Planning Grant awarded by the Eastgate Regional Council of Governments. The purpose of the plan is to improve pedestrian, cycling, and public transit infrastructure along Glenwood Avenue in order to improve access to economic and recreation opportunities for residents who live in the adjacent neighborhoods. The plan will use Complete Streets and Safe Routes principles to make walking, biking, and taking the bus safe, viable, and affordable options for residents of the neighborhoods along Glenwood Avenue. The plan will also help to build better connections between the neighborhoods and recreation opportunities in Mill Creek MetroParks. It will improve quality of life, health outcomes, access to jobs, prevent pedestrian fatalities, and help to overcome racial inequities perpetuated by a regional transportation system focused on catering to cars and commuters rather than residents in neighborhoods. The planning process is set to kick off in late summer with a public involvement process where residents will establish plan priorities.

GRASS CUTTING AND CLEANUP TEAM

With spring in full swing, the Grass Cutting and Cleanup Team has been focused primarily on mowing and maintaining properties in the greater Glenwood Avenue area. Since April, the team has completed over 2,500 cuts to properties owned by YNDC and hundreds of vacant lots. On rain days, the team has continued work cleaning out several homes that YNDC is currently rehabilitating and has begun cleanout and cleanup work at 1133 Glenwood Avenue, a small commercial building along the corridor.

SIDEWALK REPLACEMENT

YNDC replaced broken sidewalks on and adjacent to Mineral Springs Avenue in preparation for the construction of new homes on the street. This project was supported by the City of Youngstown's Community Development Block Grant program as part of an effort to implement the Citywide Housing Strategy by supporting new and affordable housing development.

Dangerous and broken sidewalks were also replaced on the blocks adjacent to Glenwood Community Park including Sherwood Avenue, Parkview Avenue, and West Indianola Avenue, funded in part by 5th Ward Councilwoman Lauren McNally. This sidewalk replacement project is part of ongoing implementation of the Youngstown Safe Routes to Parks Plan, which calls for the replacement of broken and unsafe sidewalks around Glenwood Community Park.

In total 1.500 linear feet of broken and unsafe sidewalks have been replaced.

YOUNGSTOWN CITY COUNCIL PASSES CITYWIDE CRA EXPANSION

On Wednesday, June 16, Youngstown City Council passed legislation to expand the city's Community Reinvestment Area (CRA) citywide as outlined in Youngstown's Housing Conditions Analysis and Strategy to Improve Housing Conditions adopted in March 2021.

A CRA allows for property tax abatements for homeowners who make major improvements to their property and for developers who build new housing units or renovate existing ones. The purpose of the CRA is to encourage the stabilization and revitalization of neighborhoods through temporary abatements of property tax increases for improvements in eligible areas.

Expanding the CRA citywide along with other strategies will encourage investment in Youngstown's housing stock and increase overall housing quality. Big thanks to Mayor Brown, Youngstown City Council, and Youngstown's Community Planning and Economic Development Department for this important action step. The next step in the process is to submit the necessary documentation to the State of Ohio.

YOUNGSTOWN HOUSING TASK FORCE CONTINUES EFFORTS TO HOLD PROBLEM LANDLORDS ACCOUNTABLE

With public health restrictions lifted, the Youngstown Housing Task Force will be reconvening in-person soon to plan next steps to hold problem landlords accountable for improving the condition of their homes in Youngstown's neighborhoods. The Task Force and YNDC filed a public nuisance receivership action earlier this year against problem landlord Linda Roe for the condition of a property that she owns on Parkcliff Avenue on Youngstown's south side. The case continues and has compelled Roe to make repairs to this and several other homes that she owns in Youngstown's neighborhoods, with the next hearing set for mid-July. While some repairs have been made, much work remains to be done, and the Task Force will continue to demand action until she brings the property into compliance. The Task Force is planning next steps to address multiple problem landlords who have failed to address the condition of their properties and failed to respond to multiple attempts to meet with them.

YNDC BEGINS WORK TO DEVELOP GLENWOOD FRESH MARKET

Thanks to a grant award of \$107,221 from Mercy Health Foundation Mahoning Valley YNDC has begun work on the Glenwood Fresh Market (Market). The Market will be located in a storefront at YNDC's plaza at 2915 Glenwood Avenue and will provide year-round access to free fresh fruits, vegetables, and other healthy food items for low-income residents. The Market will also provide space for cooking demonstrations, nutrition education, and health screenings.
