



NEW FUNDING & AWARDS

YNDC AND PARTNERS AWARDED US DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE GRANT

YNDC and its partners, the City of Youngstown, Youngstown Police Department, and Youngstown State University, were awarded an \$850,000 grant from the US Department of Justice to implement a crime reduction plan in a target area on the south side of Youngstown, focused on Market Street, South Avenue, and the Taft and Cottage Grove Neighborhoods. The Byrne Criminal Justice Innovation grant will fund crime-reduction activities in four key areas: small business safety; residential property safety, community empowerment, and neighborhood revitalization.



REVITALIZE HOME MORTGAGE LAUNCHES COMMUNITY LENDING PROGRAM

REVITALIZE Home Mortgage is launching a new community lending program in partnership with the City of Youngstown, Home Savings, and the Youngstown Neighborhood Development Corporation (YNDC). The City of Youngstown provided a \$500,000 grant to capitalize the loan fund that will provide first-mortgage loans to individuals who are unable to obtain bank financing to purchase homes rehabilitated by YNDC. Loans will be serviced by Home Savings. RHM provides a first-mortgage financing source with flexible underwriting criteria for borrowers who don't meet requirements for conventional banking products.

YNDC AWARDED USDA FINI GRANT

On Tuesday, August 8, the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) National Institute of Food and Agriculture (NIFA) announced the award of \$498,880 to YNDC from the Food Insecurity Nutrition Incentive (FINI) program, to encourage Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) participants in Youngstown, Ohio to purchase healthy foods. The grant will fund the Eating for Health in the Mahoning Valley project, which will increase food access by helping SNAP customers purchase fresh produce at 6 farmers markets and local food outlets in Youngstown and Warren, and will also expand the Mercy Health Fruit and Vegetable Prescription Program, which provides vouchers to Mercy Health patients to purchase fruits and vegetables in order to increase healthy eating.

MERCY HEALTH FOUNDATION AWARDS YNDC \$280,000 GRANT

On Tuesday June 13th, the Mercy Health Foundation announced the award of \$280,000 to YNDC in support of the Food Insecurity Nutrition Incentive (FINI) program and the Eating for Health in Mahoning Valley project. The funds will support SNAP customers in the Fruit and Vegetable Prescription program, which provides prescription vouchers to patients to purchase fruits and vegetable to supplement a healthy diet.

THE RAYMOND JOHN WEAN FOUNDATION AWARDS \$200,000 TO REVITALIZE HOME MORTGAGE FOR LOAN FUND

The Raymond John Wean Foundation has awarded a \$200,000 grant to REVITALIZE HOME Mortgage for community lending. This investment will leverage community resources to provide a two-county lending model for homebuyers who are unable to access conventional banking products.

YNDC TALKS MARKET RATE MARKET READY REHAB AT OHIO LAND BANK CONFERENCE

On Tuesday, September 12, Ian Beniston, YNDC Executive Director and Tiffany Sokol, YNDC Housing Director presented a session titled Getting the Work Done: Youngstown's Model to Revitalize Vacant Homes in a Weak Market Context. The session highlighted the work of YNDC, Mahoning County Land Bank, and City of Youngstown over the past two years to develop an effective and growing market rate, market ready vacant home rehabilitation model.

DELEGATION OF COMMUNITY LEADERS FROM DANVILLE, VIRGINIA VISITS YNDC

On Tuesday, July 25, a delegation of community leaders from Danville, Virginia visited YNDC to obtain an in-depth understanding of YNDC and its operations. The delegation included board and staff members from the newly formed Danville Neighborhood Development Corporation, as well as city and philanthropic partners. The day included a discussion of YNDC's creation, initial capacity building, project/program site tour and discussion, and question and answer throughout the day.

VOLUNTEERS HELP CLEAN UP 2691 MCFARLAND AVENUE

UNITED WAY PARTNERS WITH YNDC FOR 2017 DAY OF CARING

The United Way of Youngstown and the Mahoning Valley partnered with YNDC for the 2017 Day of Caring on Friday, September 1st. Approximately 500 volunteers from 40 volunteer groups participated in the annual day of service and helped scrape sidewalks, clean up vacant properties, clear brush and debris from pedestrian walkways, and secure vacant houses on the East Side of Youngstown. The groups that participated were 98 Marketing, Aim, American National University, Belmont Pines Hospital, Boardman High School, Burgan Real Estate, Casal's, Campbell City Schools, CCA, Committee to Elect Tito Brown, Committee to Elect Seam McKinney, Compco, Dearing Compressor, Eastgate, Exal, Factset, First National Bank, Ivy Woods Manor, Huntington Bank, Gateways Industries, Jackson-Milton School, James and Sons, Lowe's Boardman, Lowe's Niles, Men of Standard, The Colony, Mercy Health, Ohio Edison, Pizza Joes, Rich Center for Autism, StepAbove Home Care, UAW 1112, UAW 1714, Valley Care, WKBN, Youngstown Air Reserve Station, YSU Room 203, YWRC, and YSU Honors College. 



YNDC HOLDS CITYWIDE ACTION TEAM MEETINGS

On Wednesday, July 12 and Tuesday, August 22 leaders and representatives from neighborhoods across the City of Youngstown gathered at YNDC for the first two Citywide Neighborhood Action Team meetings. Residents discussed issues facing their respective neighborhoods and, through a number of exercises, were able to pinpoint common problems that affect residents throughout the city. Some of the issues discussed included infrastructure development, lighting, crime, vacant property upkeep, youth and senior activities, parks, code violations, policing, and more.

LINCOLN KNOLLS PLAZA COMES ALIVE FOR BETTER BLOCK EVENT

On Saturday, August 5, the Lincoln Knolls Plaza came alive with vendors, a farmers market, kids activities, music, dance performances, an art gallery, and haircuts for kids. The event, called the East Side Better Block, sought to draw positive attention to the plaza, which has a number of vacant spaces. The Better Block events highlight what underutilized spaces could be like with more businesses and activities. The goal of the event is to catalyze more permanent improvements in the future. The East Side Better Block was sponsored by the Lincoln Knolls Community Watch, YNDC, the Northeast Homeowners, and 2nd Ward Councilman TJ Rogers.

SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL SIDEWALK CONSTRUCTION CELEBRATED WITH RIBBON CUTTING AT TAFT ELEMENTARY

On Tuesday, August 29, city leaders and residents gathered at Taft Elementary to commemorate the completion of sidewalk improvements with a ribbon-cutting ceremony. Several sidewalks directly adjacent to the elementary school were replaced in order to make it safer for neighborhood students that walk to school. The construction was made possible by the Safe Routes to School program, a collaboration between the Youngstown Neighborhood Development Corporation, the Youngstown City School District, the City of Youngstown, the Western Reserve Health Foundation, the Community Foundation of the Mahoning Valley, and the William Swanston Charitable Fund.



PARK IMPROVEMENTS BEGIN

Implementation of the Parks Improvement Action Plan continues with funding from the William Swanston Charitable Fund, managed by the Community Foundation of Youngstown and the Mahoning Valley. Improvements have included repair and resurfacing of the basketball court and walking trail at John White Park, new climbing structures at John White and Homestead Parks, additional lighting at Glenwood, Homestead, and John White Parks, camera installation at Glenwood and Homestead Parks, and new benches, trash cans, and grills at Glenwood Homestead, and John White Parks.

SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL RECAP

During July, August and September, YNDC's Safe Routes to School program has engaged 1,186 youth in pedestrian and bicycle safety education. Walking School Buses have been held at Harding, Williamson, Taft and Wilson Elementary Schools with 87 youth participating. Students were invited to meet at predetermined locations to walk to school discussing pedestrian safety issues such as crossing the street, utilizing crossing guards, and navigating neighborhoods and roads. Bicycles provided by the RedZone and City Kids Care were raffled off to students in the Youngstown City School District. YNDC provided a helmet to each of the 800 bicycle winners demonstrating the proper way to wear a helmet and discussing the importance of wearing one while riding bikes. Bike rodeos were held at the Youngstown Parks Summer Day Camp program and YMHA properties, such as Rockford Village and Brier Hill, as well as community events such as the Rayen Neighborhood Celebration, the South Side Academy Back to School Bash, the Taft Back to School Bonanza and the Fall Fest Bike rodeo educating 295 youth on the importance of wearing a helmet and safe bicycling behaviors while providing obstacle courses to practice their skills. Youth can practice starting and stopping, weaving through cones, and scanning behind them for traffic or other objects creating barriers for safe passage.



PUBLIC MEETING HELD FOR OAK HILL NEIGHBORHOOD ACTION PLAN

On Thursday, September 28, Oak Hill residents and stakeholders met at the corner of Hillman and Warren for a meeting to review a draft of the Oak Hill Neighborhood Action Plan, recently created by YNDC and the City of Youngstown. The plan included recommendations for addressing residents' primary concerns: housing and property issues; infrastructure repair and maintenance; crime and safety concerns; and economic development. The plan outlined goals for demolishing highly visible blighted structures, improving sidewalk conditions near neighborhood assets and bus stop locations, and improving Falls Playground. All in attendance were given an opportunity to provide comments and input on the plan, which will be incorporated into the final draft of the plan.



NEIGHBORHOOD STABILIZATION

FORMER GINA'S DRIVE THRU ON GLENWOOD AVENUE CLEANED AND GREENED

Gina's Drive Thru, once located at 1942 Glenwood Avenue, was one of the worst nuisance properties on Glenwood Avenue. Rife with crime, public intoxication and vagrancy, shutting this store down was a high priority for surrounding residents and business owners. After years of public outcry, the store finally closed its doors in 2015. Not long after, the building caught fire and became a public eyesore and safety hazard. YNDC partnered with the City of Youngstown to have the building demolished in late 2016, and conducted a community workday in March to clear cut the dense weeded overgrowth from the back of the property and clean up the surrounding sidewalks. In the summer of 2017, the property was graded and seeded through a partnership between YNDC staff and Ransom Ware of Ware's Demolition, who provided technical support and assisted with site clearance and cleanup. This formerly nuisance property has now been converted into a community asset that complements the adjacent Mineral Springs garden. Tree plantings for the site are currently in the works to convert this lot into a usable public open space for the surrounding community.



NEIGHBORHOOD STABILIZATION

CITYWIDE GRASS CUTTING CONTINUES THROUGH OCTOBER 2017

YNDC's Citywide Grass Cutting program continued for a third season in 2017. The program has resulted in 9,857 unique cuts to vacant properties as of September 28, serving every neighborhood in the city. The program is on track to exceed 10,000 cuts for the third season in a row. The Citywide Grass Cutting Program employed 13 city residents this season, providing them with on-the-job training in grass cutting, property maintenance, equipment maintenance, and professional landscaping. The program ends for the season on October 15.

AMERICORPS REVITALIZE CONTINUE CLEAN UP GLENWOOD AVENUE CAMPAIGN

Throughout September 2017, YNDC AmeriCorps REVITALIZE members have been cutting and clearing brush back from sidewalks, removing dead trees, and completing other vacant lot improvement work. In the weeks to come, AmeriCorps REVITALIZE members will begin planting dozens of trees along the corridor in an effort to restore the tree canopy.
